Future-proofing your workplace while navigating challenges and opportunities

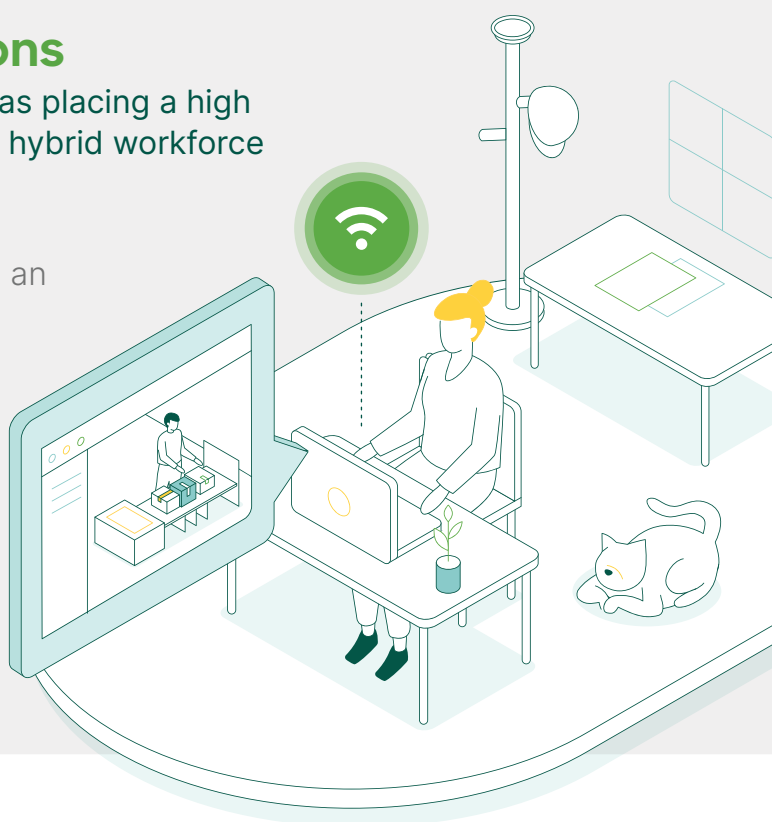
We are in the midst of workplace and workforce disruption. As organizations have adopted hybrid work practices, technology has become critical to transforming business models and shifting the way work gets done.

Navigating a changing workforce

78% of organizations perceive the C-suite as placing a high priority on enabling a hybrid workforce

- More than **77% of IT leaders** have observed an increase in **employee churn** over the past 12 months versus 2 years ago
- **72%** indicate that it is highly challenging to empower workers to make **process/workflow changes** on their own with current technology



Managing business and IT disruptions

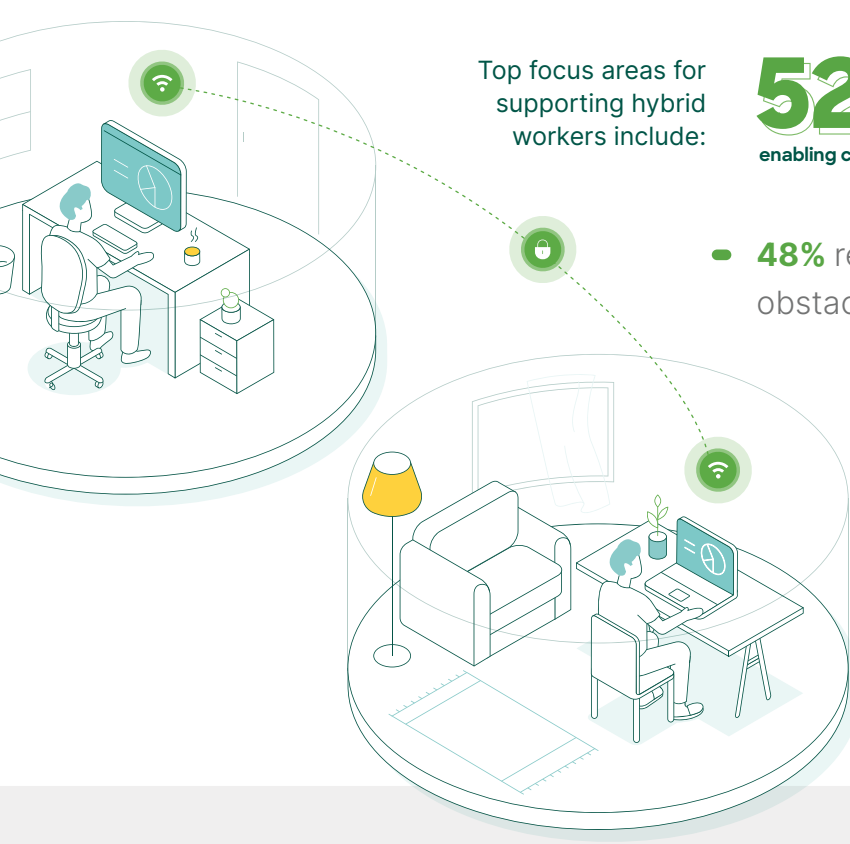
Top focus areas for supporting hybrid workers include:

- **48%** report **cybersecurity threats** as a primary obstacle to improving workforce experiences
- From a technology standpoint, enterprises are prioritizing **application modernization**, **security improvement**, and **upgrades to collaboration tools** to support hybrid workers



Ensuring seamless work experiences for employees

95% consider it highly important to have real-time intelligence to support workforce experiences

- **57%** indicate that it is highly challenging to provide **consistent, seamless, location-agnostic support** for employees
- Respondents report it's most challenging to enable **parity for remote employees** with respect to technology access, network security, IT support, and access to colleagues



With IT leaders becoming strategic partners in driving business outcomes and facilitating better employee experiences, they are on the hunt for solutions for not only the disruptions they face today, but also future disruptions to the business.
